



Psalm 62:5-6 Find rest, O my soul, in God alone; my hope comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress. I will not be shaken.

Psalm 62 was written by King David during a very difficult and dangerous time in his life and family. It is during those times that we need outside help and support. Unfortunately we are often left to find our own way through. What do some do to sustain themselves? Work harder, pray more, run faster and longer. Often we need to stop running and find a quiet place to be alone with God. Look deep and slow at his promises as well as remembering his past faithfulness. Pour out your troubles, sorrows or pain and know he listens and cares while you rest in his promises to keep you. That does not mean do it alone. There are times we need help and support from others. They become an extension of God's loving arms.

To trust and place faith in others can result in disappointment because man is limited, flawed and not always available. God surpasses all those limitations. God alone provides hope for tomorrow because he is already in tomorrow. He holds everything together and able to sustain us when everyone fails including ourselves.

Verse 7 uses images such as rock, fortress and unshakable. God is faithful, strong, and compassionate, a solid place of hope for tomorrow. Whatever condition we find ourselves in will not be permanent, it will change. However long it may take you are never alone.
