This is Minayah and her almost 3 year old daughter, Leslie. Minayah came to Metro Hope on 2.15.2024, and graduated on 10.10.2025. She knew of Jesus when she came to Metro Hope but did not have a relationship with Him. Today she is filled with the Holy Spirit and a deep love for Jesus. Minayah became staff several months after graduating. She works part-time in the Children's Learning Center with the full-time staff, and she also goes to college.

On Monday, February 16, Minayah was working in the Children's Center with the full-time staff who stepped out for about 10 minutes. When she came back, Minayah was laying on the floor, not breathing, without a heart beat. Her face and neck were blue. Staff called 911 and performed CPR until the ambulance arrived. One of the staff, Tracy, was praying so loudly that the paramedics asked her to leave so they could concentrate. She went into the next room and continued to pray along with the other staff. When Minayah was taken by ambulance, she was still not breathing and had no heart beat. The doctors did get her heart started, put her on a ventilator, and put her into an induced coma. A brain scan was completely black on the front right side, less severe on the left. The doctors would not know the extent of the damage for 72 hours. The staff at the Women's Center were at the hospital along with Minayah's Aunt Joni. We were praying for a Lazarus moment. The steady stream of visitors and prayer being spoken over Minayah did not cease. This could not be the end of Minayah's amazing Jesus story!

"What do we do with little Leslie?", was the next question. We made a plan that was shared with a social worker who agreed that Leslie's life should stay as normal as possible with people she knew and was comfortable and safe with. One of the staff, Auntie Tiffany, would take Leslie home with her at night, bring her back in the morning to go to her daycare, return to the center for a while, then back to Tiffany's home. Leslie loves these overnights with the pets and Uncle Josh, Tiffany's husband! We were worried about Leslie ending up with family that was not safe. The social worker at the hospital was in agreement, and so was Aunt Joni, who is a wonderful woman that loves Minayah. It is so good how The Lord goes before us! Leslie is safe so now we can focus on Minayah.

Tuesday brought no change except that the medicine that was keeping her in a coma was slowly reduced so that the doctors could get a better understanding of where she was physically and mentally. Can she breathe on her own? Will her brain function the way it should? Would she suffer from brain damage for the rest of her life? Will she live? The doctors encouraged us to talk to her, "She can hear you". We noticed on the monitor recording her brain activity that when someone specific would talk, the wave length would stretch out, not spike so frequently. Wow, evidence that she was with us and God was in control. We felt hope seeing those wave lengths after learning about the brain scans with so much darkness. Minayah had a ventilator, IVs, and a feeding tube, her body was so still, it was so hard to see our beloved sister in this state. We kept praying for a Lazarus miracle. David Crowder sings about hospitals turning into cathedrals, and that is exactly what Minayah's room became, full of worship and prayer. Even the nurses were noticing! Only Jesus could change this story (over)

On Wednesday, she was completely off of the coma medicine so now the doctors were slowly reducing the sedation medicine. The first thing we saw was that her legs were twitching! Praise God, her nervous system was waking up! When we prayed over her, I, Cammy, was holding her hand and I felt her arm move. I looked to see her shoulders moving! I asked the others if they had seen her shoulders move and they said yes, so we kept praying. Aunt Joni joined us in this prayer. We all felt so hopeful! I had some alone time with Aunt Joni, who was amazed at the community Minayah had around her. She told me that Minayah had tried to share her Jesus with Joni at Christmas, as she shrugged her shoulders a bit. I told Joni, "I'm so glad you got to experience the Jesus that Minayah loves". We had been praying for Joni the whole time. Joni replied, "I am forever changed." Praise God! Later that evening Minayah was sitting up in bed, trying to get out of bed.

Thursday's email to our praying community was: Today has been a day of witnessing God's power! Minayah is awake, recognizing the people around her, nodding yes to the question of listening to worship music, and even raising her hand! We were praying for a Lazarus moment and that is what God did! We are seeing much evidence that her brain is better than expected but will hear more tomorrow. She isn't talking as the ventilator is still in her but she was breathing on her own for 4 hours today. All we can do is praise God! I just got a text that the MRI that was taken tonight showed NOTHING ACUTE per the doctor's quick note! 2 days ago it was black on the right side. Wow, The Lord in all of His Glory!

On Saturday, Minayah was moved from ICU to a regular room. She was eating and walking on her own. She was recognizing people and talking up a storm! Her speech and mind were clearer than the day before. Our Minayah was back! Thank you Jesus! The doctors determined that she should have a diffibulator implanted for protection. They do not know why Minayah's heart stopped. On Sunday, Minayah asked to be baptized before her surgery. On Monday, Pastor Jason from North Heights came to the hospital for the baptism. It was a sweet moment that brought tears to all of our eyes, including Aunt Joni! The room was overflowing with worship!



Minayah had her surgery on Thursday and all went well. On Friday, she walked up the sidewalk back into Metro Hope, her home! She was welcomed with the cheers, applause, and hugs from the residents and staff. Our precious Minayah is home. She knows that Jesus saved her life, again!

Minayah is doing well! Minayah was so excited to get back to work that she worked in the front office on Monday. Little Leslie is spending time with her sweet mama! Minayah will continue with the doctor's care until she is released to her full, beautiful life. I am so blessed to watch Minayah at church each week. Her love for Jesus flows out of her! I learned that she wants an open seat on each side of her when she worships and sings because she wants to move with the Spirit so sitting too close could be dangerous!

Please keep Minayah in your prayers because the doctors don't know why her heart stopped!

All we can say is Thank You!! Thank you, Jesus, for saving our sister! Thank you, Father, for never forsaking us! Thank you, Lord, that you continue to perform miracles, rescuing people from death, creating Lazarus moments for each of us to see Your power and glory! And I thank you! You provided a place for Minayah to find the love of her life, Jesus! She continues to live with us so that she has a safe place for herself and her daughter. You help to provide that too! With tears I say, "Thank you for loving us as Jesus loves us here at Metro Hope!" ~Cammy

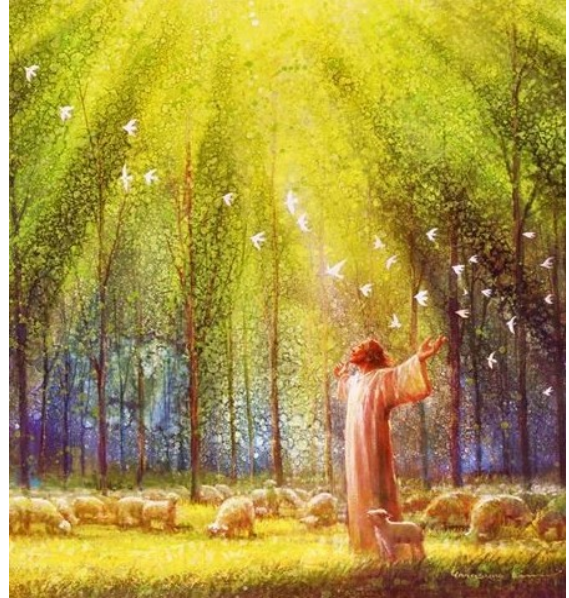
